The Chess Confederation of the Americas (CCA); the National Chess Federation of Mexico, A.C. (FENAMAC); and the Organizing Committee of the Copa Revolución 2026

are pleased to invite:

All FIDE member national chess federations of North America (Canada, USA and Mexico) to participate in the

North American Youth Chess Championship 2026 In Mexico City from November 10 to 17, 2026

1) Venue:

- Hotel del Prado
Av. Marina Nacional 399, Veronica Anzures, Miguel Hidalgo, 11300 Mexico City, Mexico.

2) Eligibility and Categories:

- The North American Youth Chess Championship 2026 is open to players representing the national chess federations of the three CCA member countries in North America (Canada, USA and Mexico) who have no outstanding financial obligations to the CCA, in accordance with the CCA Statutes and Financial Regulations. Each national federation may register as many players as it wishes.

3) Participants:

3.1) Official Players

Each national federation may register one (1) Official Player in each of the twelve (12) tournament categories. The Organizer will cover 60% of the accommodation and meal expenses for a maximum of twelve (12) Official Players and one (1) Head of Delegation per federation, provided that the delegation includes at least four (4) official players. It is the responsibility of each national federation to register its Official Players directly with the Organizer.

3.2) Additional Players

The North American Youth Chess Championship 2026 is an open tournament (with no minimum FIDE rating requirement), and each National Federation may register as many players as it wishes. All players must have the endorsement of their Federation, which must be a member of the Chess Confederation of the Americas and affiliated with FIDE, unless otherwise specified by the CCA in accordance with the current regulations.

All players who are not registered as Official Players will be classified as Additional Players. These players are responsible for covering all their expenses, including registration, travel, accommodation, and meals.

3.3) Deadline for Official Players

To ensure the proper conditions of the tournament, each of the three North American national federations must submit the registration forms of their Official Players to the Organizer before midnight (Mexico City Central Time) on **Thursday, September 10, 2026**. After the deadline, participants may no longer register as Official Players and will be classified as Additional Players, and must pay the corresponding registration fees and applicable late charges. **International bank transfers shall be subject to an additional US\$35.00 fee per deposit sent.**

3.4) Parents, Legal Guardians and Responsible Adults

All players under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a responsible adult, such as a parent, legal guardian, coach, or another expressly designated adult, who must be registered with the Organizer as the minor's responsible companion. The same companion may be responsible for several players under the age of 18. Companions will assume full responsibility for the conduct of the minors under their care.

The player who wins the championship in their category will be declared the 2026 North American Youth Chess Champion in that category. If eligible, direct titles will be awarded in accordance with the FIDE Title Regulations (B01), effective as of January 1, 2026

6) System and Time Control

Playing System:

- 9-round Swiss System.

Time Control:

- 90 minutes per player for the entire game, with an increment of 30 seconds per move.

Default Time:

- 30 minutes from the scheduled start of the round. After this time, the player will be declared absent. One forfeit will result in withdrawal from the event unless the player notifies the arbiter of their category of their intention to continue participating before the pairings for the next round are made.

Tie-Breaks:

- At the end of the final round of each category, ties will be resolved using the following criteria, in order:
1. Buchholz Cut 1, 2. Buchholz, 3. Sonneborn-Berger, 4. Cumulative System (sum of progressive scores), 5. Direct Encounter, and 6. Greater number of wins.

Pairings:

- Pairings will be made using the Swiss Manager software. The results of each round will be published immediately after the official printout.
- Any discrepancy in the results must be reported to the Chief Arbiter of the respective category before the start of the round following the one in question. It is the responsibility of the affected players to report such discrepancies. Failure to do so, if it affects subsequent pairings leading to prize eligibility, will result in the Organizing Committee not proceeding with the payment of such prizes.
- In accordance with item D.10 of the FIDE Swiss System (Rating-Based) Regulations, pairings will not be modified once published, except in the cases provided for in that regulation.

Fair Play:

- Fair Play measures will be applied in accordance with the FIDE Anti-Cheating Regulations. It is not permitted to bring electronic or communication devices into the playing area (e.g., smartwatch, tablet, mobile phone). Bags, purses, backpacks, and briefcases are also not allowed in the playing venue. Failure to comply with these measures will result in the loss of the game.

Player Conduct:

- All participants are subject to the FIDE Laws of Chess and must behave at all times during the tournament in accordance with the statutes of the CCA and FIDE, as well as the highest standards of sportsmanship. Players are expected to attend all official events approved by the CCA and the Organizer, including the Opening and Closing Ceremonies. Players and Heads of Delegation are also expected to attend the Technical Meeting. If necessary, the Chief Arbiter may convene additional Technical Meetings. Players must cooperate with the media and be available for brief interviews immediately after each game. Players must comply with the requirements of the FIDE Regulations (FIDE Handbook C.01, Article 8.1) to maintain a dignified appearance at all times during the event.

7) Appeals:

- The Chair of the Appeals Committee shall be the Continental President or a person designated by him. During the Technical Meeting, the remaining members of the Appeals Committee will be elected. The Committee shall consist of three (3) regular members and two (2) reserve members. Any protest against an arbiter's decision must be submitted in writing to the Appeals Committee within one (1) hour after the end of the round, accompanied by a deposit of US\$200.00, which will be refunded if the decision is favorable to the appellant.

The corresponding payment may be made through the following methods:

- Payment by debit or credit card through the website coparevolucion.com.mx under the **ONLINE PAYMENT** section, subject to an **additional 8% fee** for foreign card processing fees.
 - By international bank transfer, International bank transfer, subject to an additional **US\$35.00** fee per deposit for international banking charges (provided that the service is available at the originating bank).
 - If permitted by the US or Canadian Federation, registrations may be consolidated and submitted through the respective Federation, subject to a **US\$35.00** international transaction fee per transfer or deposit.
- It is mandatory for all participants to complete the registration form available at <https://forms.gle/HnGiSSLWBfGYs7mX9>, or by scanning the registration link, and to attach proof of payment, upon which the registration will be confirmed. The Organizing Committee shall not be responsible for payments made by players who have not submitted their registration through the registration module.
 - Registrations completed electronically and bank deposits, subject to successful clearance, will be accepted only until Monday, November 9, 2026, at 16:00 hours. After this date, registrations will be accepted only at the event venue upon presentation of the corresponding proof of payment.
 - Any registration completed in due time and form shall not, under any circumstances, be cancelled, and the deposited amount will not be refunded.
 - The Organizer will transfer to the bank account of the Chess Confederation of the Americas the corresponding portion of the registration fees prior to the start of Round 1, unless otherwise instructed by the CCA.

Accreditations Passes

Coaches, parents, and accompanying persons must have their official tournament accreditation in order to enter the playing hall during permitted times and remain in the areas designated for the event within the hotel. Failure to present such accreditation will result in denial of access and removal from these areas.

9) Airport Transfers

Round-trip transportation will be provided from Mexico City International Airport to the official hotel on November 10 and from the official hotel back to Mexico City International Airport on November 17, at a cost of **US\$50.00** per person

10) Rapid and Blitz Tournaments

Applicable Regulations

The Rapid and Blitz Championships will be played in accordance with the FIDE Laws of Chess and the FIDE General Competition Rules, and will be rated for FIDE Rapid and Blitz ratings.

The tournament will be played under a **9-round Open** Swiss System.

Time control Rapid: 10 minutes plus a 5-second increment per move, starting from move one.

Time control Blitz: 3 minutes plus a 2-second increment per move, starting from move one.

For categories in which the competition is played under a Swiss system:

If at the end of the tournament two or more players are tied, the tie-breaks will be applied as follows: a) Buchholz Cut 1 b) Buchholz c) Sonneborn-Berger d) Cumulative System - sum of progressive scores e) Direct Encounter f) Greater number of wins.

For categories in which the competition is played under a round-robin format, the final ranking of players will be determined by the number of points scored.

If at the end of the tournament two or more players are tied, the tie will be broken as follows:

a) Direct Encounter b) Greater number of wins c) Greater number of wins with Black d) Sonneborn-Berger with real points e) Koya System

The top five (05) places in Rapid and Blitz in each Open and Girls category will be awarded as follows:

Penalty for Not Staying at the Official Hotel or for Reservations Made Outside the Organizing Committee

Participants, coaches, and accompanying persons who do not stay at the official hotel will be required to pay a penalty of **US\$200.00 per person** to the organization. Likewise, **any reservation made directly** with the hotel, through agencies, online platforms, **or by any means other than the Organizing Committee** shall be considered non-compliance, and the same penalty will apply per person (applicable to players, coaches, and accompanying persons).

The penalty stated in the previous section does not apply to players representing Mexico.

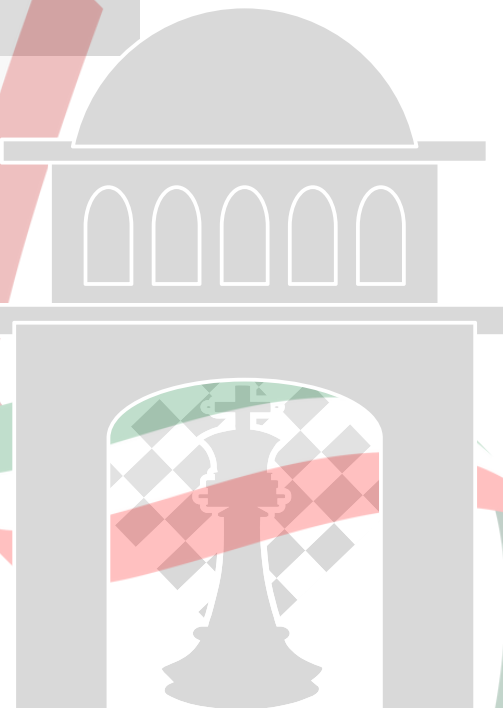
